What You Need to Know While You're Here

Compassionate Camping

Roping off areas to save space for people coming later is not allowed. Your campsite should be no more than 20 feet x 25 feet (except for large RVs).

- Campsites should be 10 feet apart.
- Be inviting to campers looking for space.
- Park to conserve as much space as possible.
- See Vehicle Safety Section on this page.

Use off the ground camp stoves or grills for cooking. Have a fire extinguisher handy. Never leave fires unattended.

NO ground fires, fireworks or luminaries!

Use trash and recycling barrels as marked.

QUIET CAMPING hours are 10 p.m.- 8 a.m. Shhh...the baby is sleeping! zzzzz.

 Drive only when necessary to reduce the chance of an accident and to reduce our footprint on this hay farm. ALWAYS USE THE RED/YELLOW/GREEN FLAG SYSTEM!

No smoking in performance or food areas. Field-strip all materials. No butts on the ground!

Be kind and considerate of neighbors.

- For legitimate health and safety concerns seek Security or Medical assistance.
- "If you see something, say something."

THE HIGH MEADOW CAMPING AREA is for

tent camping only. You may drive up and drop your gear at the turn-around Wednesday and until Noon Thursday. Then park in the Car Corral across the street. On Sunday morning you can drive back up to the turn-around to get your gear under the direction of our staff. Sorry! Driving out to your campsite is not allowed. Only go to the turn-around!

Shuttle Buses and Handicapped Assistance

Free buses loop from Day Parking to the High Meadow Stage turn-around with stops at the Ticket Gate, Handicapped Camping, Catskill Stage, Medical Tent. See festival map on pages 8-9 for stops. Buses stop running one hour after the last stage show ends.



Are you new to Grey Fox? Not sure where you're going? Haven't found a spot? Our camping staff at the Traffic & Safety Tent can help you locate a camping space. Ask us!



 Our First Aid Tent is open 24 hours per day. It is located in lower vendor area across from the Info Booth. See map pages 8-9.

- Keep hydrated. Water! Water! Water!
- Use sun screen several times a day.
- Pace yourself. Get the rest you need. (Yes, we KNOW it's a festival!)

 Protect yourself from ticks. Ticks spread Lyme Disease. Use insect repellent and check yourself daily. Stay away from the woods, leaf litter and tall grasses (favorite tick habitat).

- Avoid foot injuries. Always wear shoes.
- Use a flashlight at night to keep from twisting an ankle, falling, etc.
- Know your limit of adult beverages!

LOST CHILDREN should be taken to the First Aid Tent on lower Vendor Row. An announcement will be made ASAP to help reunite parent and child. Know where your children are at all times. Write your children's names and contact info on their wristband. Make sure children know where you're camped. Let's be careful out there!

KNOW WHERE YOU'RE CAMPED & PARKED

Things look VERY different as we fill up, especially at night! Be sure you and your kids know your Grey Fox address. Separated from your party? Make a plan in advance. We suggest meeting at the Info Booth "on the

hour." It won't be long before you hook up. And you won't waste time looking for each other. It really, really works!


To All Attendees

- Every attendee must wear a valid wrist band.

- Camping is valid from 7am Wed thru 5pm Sun.
- Vehicles must display a valid parking sticker or risk being towed and fined.

Please either park in the Car Corral or stay parked at your campsite for the weekend. It increases safety, creates more camping space and lessens our impact on the hay fields here at the Walsh Farm. Drive only if you must!

- Take as little space as possible when parking. Think small!
- Work with your neighbors to make your experience safe and fun.
- Report unsafe conditions to Traffic and Safety headquarters or Security.
- Follow our flag system (below):

Look for Our Traffic Flags

For the safe movement of vehicles, colored flags will wave at several locations around the grounds.

GREEN = It's safe to drive (-5 mph). YELLOW = If you leave the site, you risk not getting your car back to your camp. RED = Do NOT move any vehicles!

Guidelines to ensure that everyone enjoys the music at Grey Fox

▶ CHAIR / TARP / BLANKET SECTION: The left side of the amphitheater (between the stage and the soundbooth) is for lawn chairs. Regular lawn and beach chairs are okay here. Tarps and blankets: please do not exceed 6x9 feet. See festival map.

DANCE AREA: The front right 1/3 of the amphitheater (between the stage and the soundbooth) is a dance area, and a "no chairs zone." See map.

• **OPEN SEATING**: Behind the sound booth, all types of chairs are fine.

 CHAIRS CAN STAY: You do not have to remove chairs each night. Take any valuables and trash each time you leave. Thank you in advance.

• CONVERSATION: Keep your conversation low. People are trying to listen to the wonderful music! You may think you're not annoying those around you, but think again. It's a concert!

• **CELL PHONES**: Set to manner mode. Leave concert areas to make or receive calls.

▶ FRONT WALKWAY: Please show respect for musicians & listeners. Use the walkway in front of the stage between songs, or better yet, between sets. Thank you for being courteous.

▶ TAKING PHOTOS: Please use the center aisle (not the front row) and do not block the view of others for more than snapping a few photos.

SMOKING IS PROHIBITED in any food or musical venue, including all tents and the high meadow amphitheatre. Go beyond the perimeter of any venue to smoke. And field dress your butts.

The Americana Songbook springs to life in the strings and voices of **Americana Family Jamboree & Barn Dance** as they perform old time, bluegrass, folk, blues and more! There'll be guitars and fiddles, banjo pickin' too, so bring your dancing shoes and be ready to sing and dance with square dance caller Megan Downes leading the way! Led by Demolition String Band members Elena Skye and Boo Reiners, the shows are fun for kids but safe for grown-ups!

Amy Seabrook Puppets. For years now, children have been watching and listening to the puppets on the Grey Fox Family Stage. They get into the issues that Amy brings to life with her handmade puppets: Issues such as honesty and fair action. The shows are always interactive and the children choose puppets to use to make their own ideas heard. Amy also teaches children's puppet workshops at Grey Fox and they are a bit like magic.

BanjerDan (Dan Mazer) mixes Americana, bluegrass, folk, country, blues, oldies, and other styles of acoustic music. Dan plays the 5-string banjo, guitar, mandolin, and dobro. He has performed all over the U.S. and internationally as a solo artist, in theatrical productions, in symphony orchestras, and as a member of several bands. 

Led by singer, songwriter, and mandolinist, AJ Lee, they have left their mark across the globe while calling California's Bay Area home. On their latest album, 2021's I'll Come Back, they returned to their acoustic roots, delivering a pure reflection of their live sound. Although falling loosely under the bluegrass label, AJL&BS's style is better defined as Americana. They generally play without banjo, with Sullivan Tuttle and Scott Gates on steel stringed acoustic guitars, AJ on mandolin, Jan Purat on fiddle, and Chad Bowen on the upright bass. Their music draws inspiration from diverse genres like country, soul, swing, rock, and jam, allowing them to create an enchanting fusion while staying true to their bluegrass core. Don't miss 'em!

Alison Brown Fri

This Grammy-winning musical pioneer who blends bluegrass, jazz, and other genres, simply defies stereotypes and expectations. Her banjo instrumentals take you on a journey of melodic joy and innovation. Alison knows what it's like to go beyond the ordinary. She's a Harvard grad who scrapped her investment banking career to tour with Alison Krauss and Union Station, and Michelle Shocked before forming The Alison Brown Quartet in 1993. Since then, she has performed at prestigious venues and festivals worldwide. If you were not already impressed, Alison is co-founder of the acclaimed indie roots music label Compass Records Group, serves on the board of the Nashville chapter of the Recording Academy, is on the adjunct faculty of Vanderbilt's Blair School of Music, and is cochair of the Steve Martin Banjo Prize. Just wait 'til you hear On Banjo, her latest beautiful work of art.

EMERGING ARTISTS Thu **The American Roots Music**

Program at the Berklee College of Music focuses on American music of the first half of the 20th century as well as all rural music in the country. Today's performances by recent graduates of the program will be led by renowned oldtime fiddler and visiting scholar in the program, Bruce Molsky. Today's performers include the astonishing Ruta Beggars (page 42), the newly formed Seselia band, the duo of Hazel Royer and Moriah Ozberkmen, and others.

Armchair Boogie Thu

Since their start on a front porch in Stevens Point, WI in 2015, Armchair Boogie has been known for their fast pickin' and infectious grooves! With Augie Dougherty (banjo, vocals), Ben Majeska (guitar, vocals), Eli Frieders (bass), and Denzel Connor (drums) the band is an up-tempo, jamminfunkgrass outfit with a little western soul in there as can be heard on, *The Western EP!* In 2018 Armchair Boogie moved

to Madison where they released their first self-titled album. They were soon touring across the US and sharing their tunes and contagiously playful personalities with more and more fans. Journeys on the road have led them to stages such as Blue Ox, Northwest String Summit, John Hartford Memorial Festival, and Merlefest. They've had the honor to share the spotlight with The Infamous Stringdusters, Yonder Mountain Stringband, Kitchen Dwellers, and many more!

Chicken Wire Empire Fri/Sat Chicken Wire Empire is a trad/contemporary bluegrass band from Wisconsin, featuring Carter Shilts (mandolin), Jordan Kroeger (upright bass), Ernest Brusubardis IV (fiddle), Starr Moss (guitar), and Jon Peik (banjo). The band started as a traditional bluegrass outfit in 2014, but soon discovered a new sound after performing an Old & In The Way tribute show. Their 2022 release Fresh Pickles features all original music by Minnesota songsmith Chris Castino (Big Wu), reimagined in Chicken Wire Empire's style. Aside from the collaboration with Castino, they've worked with songwriters and legends such as Peter Rowan, Sam Bush, Jerry Douglas, and others. Chicken Wire Empire is excited to make their debut at Grey Fox this year and share their high energy music with new audiences. You're gonna love 'em!

Damn Tall Buildings Fri Damn Tall Buildings is a bluegrass band with a punch. They started out as buskers in Boston, playing with passion and skill on the streets, and in 2019 they were Emerging Artists at Grey Fox. Now performing on the High Meadow stage, they play swing, jazz,



His guitar and harmony grace the works of Martina McBride, Dolly Parton, Willie Nelson, and many others. It's hard not to glow when we talk about Dan in bluegrass circles. We have known him as the guitarist, and mandolin player for Alison Krauss and Union Station since 1994. Throughout his 30+ year career, he's garnered 14 Grammy Awards and multiple accolades. The Dan Tyminski Band includes Gaven Largent (dobro), Maddie Denton (fiddle), Jason Davis (banjo), Grace Davis (bass), and Harry

Clark (mandolin), captivating audiences with their instrumental prowess.

Della Mae Fri

We love Della Mae and we know you do, too. They have grown up on our stage and become stars in the bluegrass world and beyond. They are a band of amazing women who play their own version of bluegrass and care about making a difference. Della Mae is Kimber Ludiker (fiddle), Celia Woodsmith (guitar), Avril Smith (guitar and mandolin), and Vickie Vaughn (bass), each one adding beautiful vocals. They have traveled the world, often for the U.S. State Department, sharing their songs and spirit with people of different cultures, learning as much as they impart. Della Mae also helps other women and girls to pursue their musical dreams. The band's new album, Family Reunion, is a celebration of getting back together after being apart for so long. Their sets are always an incredible mix of provocative covers and gorgeous originals.

Del McCoury Band Fri

When you hear that high, lonesome voice echoing from the High Meadow Stage, you'll have no doubt you're in the presence of bluegrass legend, Del McCoury and his fine band. Del's distinctive voice conveys joy, sorrow, love, and pain with equal ease. Now 84, Del goes back to the early days of bluegrass, having started as a banjo player for Bill Monroe and the Blue

Grass Boys. He eventually formed the Del McCoury Band that now features his sons Ronnie (mandolin) and Rob (banjo), along with Jason Carter (fiddle) and Alan Bartram (bass). A long-time staple at Grey Fox, Del and the boys have won two Grammys and a long list of IBMA awards. They've collaborated with artists across the musical spectrum, from Steve Earle and Phish to the Preservation Hall Jazz Band. When you hear the Del McCoury Band, you experience a visceral link between bluegrass music's past and the present. Now you know why Del McCoury is a National Endowment for the Arts Heritage Fellow. We recommend all recordings done by the band over the years.

The Dirty Grass Players Fri

No strangers to Grey Fox, The Dirty Grass Players are back! True to their name, this toe-tapping Baltimore-based quartet brings a stanky but clean groove to the stage, as can be heard on their latest album, Shiny Side Up. While one foot is rooted in traditional grass, the other is pushing boundaries with blazing harmonies and solid musicianship. Since their formation in 2017, they have won the Charm City Bluegrass band competition and have played various festivals such as Floyd-Fest, Grey Fox, Bristol Rhythm & Roots, and Delfest. The break from touring during the pandemic allowed time to pen new music and develop an even more refined performance. Composed of Connor Murray (bass), Alex Berman (banjo), Ben Kolakowski (guitar), and Ryan Rogers (mandolin) their ability to seamlessly transition from down-home bluegrass to spirited improvisation will quickly make you understand what they mean by Dirty Grass!

GREY FOX HOST BAND Dry Branch Fire Squad T/F/S/S

No Grey Fox is complete without a solid daily dose of Dry Branch Fire Squad. The host band since nearly the beginning of time, Colorado-based DBFS is known for its fiercely traditional sound and band leader Ron Thomason's captivating stories. Listening to Ron-a musician, farmer, horseman, teacher, and, to some, a preacher—will leave you smiling and likely shedding a tear (or three). He started the band in 1976, which now includes Brian Aldridge on guitar, mandolin, and vocals; Tom Boyd on dobro and vocals; and Jeff Byrd on bass and vocals. Ron, of course, plays mandolin and guitar and delivers soul-stirring vocals. We told you that to tell you this: Their mix is always magical, the fun is infectious, and their shows are a real treat. Once you become a Dry Branch Fire Squad fan, you just have to have all their Rounder recordings.

The Infamous Stringdusters Fri

There is nothing like a latenight jam with The Infamous Stringdusters. The Grammy Award-winning, cutting edge, acoustic band blends bluegrass, folk, and well, you name it. The Grammy for Best Bluegrass Album in 2021 recognized their stunning Laws of Gravity. They now have created more than a dozen studio and live albums, several EPs, and videos. The quintet is Andy Falco (guitar), Chris Pandolfi (banjo), Travis Book (bass), Jeremy Garrett (fiddle), and Andy Hall (Dobro). As they did on A Tribute to Bill Monroe (2021) the band's latest album, dives deep into their bluegrass roots with A Tribute to Flatt & Scruggs. As Travis Book says, "The concept of paying tribute to the originators of bluegrass is one we bounced around for a while and after Bill Monroe, the most logical, I think any bluegrass musician would agree, is Flatt & Scruggs. They're legendary and without Earl's banjo, bluegrass just

doesn't exist the way we know it today." And a big Grey Fox welcome to all you fans who follow the 'Dusters for their live performances from festival to festival and theater to theater. You're in for a spectacular Friday night!

Jake Blount Thu

A powerfully gifted musician and a scholar of Black American music, Jake Blount speaks ardently about the African roots of the banjo and the subtle, yet profound ways African Americans have shaped and defined the closely related categories of roots music and Americana. Drawing from sound archives and song collections, he channels the essential creativity of his Black ancestors and contemporaries. His music merges traditional songs with modern Black genres, defying boundaries and revisionist histories. Joe can often be found teaching at music camps and festivals all over the world, sharing his love of old-time music and spinning a yarn or two along with it. He is with us as an artist (Sat/Sun), as our esteemed nightly emcee (Thurs/Fri/Sat) and as a Song Swap sharer (Sat). Be sure to be there for his High Meadow solo set on Sunday

John Cadley Fri/Sat

John began playing guitar at the age of 13 and "hit the charts" at 18 as a member of The Glen Coves, a folk group that had a Top 40 hit in 1963 with the folk anthem "Hootenanny" (it's on YouTube). John will be co-teaching a two-part songwriting workshop with Martha Trachtenberg and Jim Gaudet. You'll learn how songwriters go about their craft and they hope to bring out the songwriter in you. alum), and has influenced many of today's top artists. His distinctive, emotive voice and virtuosic mandolin (chops to die for) and fiddle prowess can handle any genre. Sam's latest recording is the exquisite Radio John: Songs of John Hartford (Folkways). Joining Sam are Wes Corbett on banjo, Stephen Mougin on quitar, Todd Parks on bass, and Chris Brown on drums. While Sam joyfully shares the stage with these gifted musicians, he's definitely center stage. Kick back and get ready for an amazing performance on Saturday night at High Meadow.

SCYTHIAN Thurs

Back by popular demand, SCYTHIAN will have you dancing, jumping, and hoisting a glass with their infectious roots music. Drawing from Celtic, Eastern European, and Appalachian traditions, the band combines thunderous energy, technical prowess, and storytelling songwriting to create a barn dance meets rock concert experience. The Steep Canyon Rangers are Graham Sharp (banjo), Mike Guggino (mandolin), Nicky Sanders (fiddle), Mike Ashworth (drums), Barrett Smith (bass, guitar), and Aaron Burdett (quitar).

Stillhouse Junkies Thurs This trio of multi-instrumentalists and singers blend diverse musical influences into a truly unique sound. 


